#### Sunday:

The 'Our School a Passport to Success' project to improve learning environments brings us here to the PRESIDENT Hotel in Helsinkiy to meet teachers from 11 European countries. The challenge on my ability to express myself in English begins.

I finally feel very stimulated to learn new teaching techniques, my mind opens to new realities.

#### Monday:

We wake up at 5.30 a.m. so that we can go by metro and bus to visit our first school. I am impressed by the bicycles outside.

We are greeted by the headmistress, very familiarly, and by two Italian teachers who express their excitement at seeing us. After the presentation, the students, all barefoot, took us on a tour of the various school environments including the different workshops (sewing, carpentry, art) to encourage learning even for students with frailties. The teachers' room is particularly well maintained and equipped. Almost all the children have a tablet and the ability to speak English is evident. Silence and spaces set aside for group learning take centre stage. The self-service lunch in the canteen with students, teachers and headmaster is interesting. Pleasant and relaxing environment, focus on healthy food and very responsible and independent students.

In the afternoon, seminar at the Hotel Presidente to learn about the Finnish system.

#### Tuesday:

At the President's Hotel in the morning, some teaching strategies to create attention and motivation in students were brought to life. In particular, a playful approach to language teaching was demonstrated. In short, it turned out that it is not how much one learns but how. Meeting at the University of Economics in Helsinki: a teacher explains TEAM CLASS to emphasise the importance of interaction between teachers and pupils" BEST IDEA COME FROM THE CHILDREN". Thursday:

Due to a strike, it was not possible for us to visit the second school, so lecturers took turns at the University of Economics to explain the methodological, organisational and structural aspects of their schools. In the afternoon, a visit to the historical centre of Porvoo, a UNESCO heritage site.

#### Friday:

Wake up early for a fieldtrip to Estonia! Visit to the historical centre of Tallinn. Here too, through the guides we had the opportunity to understand how digital in schools is very advanced. We met some classes and noticed that they wear waistcoats outside the school.

### A final overview of my experience in this European training programme:

In summary, the school facilities (classrooms, laboratories, canteens, libraries, relaxation areas, gyms) are spaces designed for the needs of the students, which promotes their autonomy and serenity. Teaching is focused on the realisation of a project in which theory is a support and not the ultimate goal of learning. In this way, the student is the protagonist and becomes aware of his or her own success in school, thus ensuring lifelong learning. I have collected small ideas to be implemented in small steps to improve our school system to sow the seeds for a united, civilised and peaceful Europe.
